Diesel Engine Inventory and Compliance Plan Submittal

The Air Quality Committee alerts all SCAP members that under the Air Toxics Control Measure (ATCM) for Stationary Diesel Engines adopted by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) last year, **all** engine owners and operators of stationary diesel engines are required to submit certain diesel engine information to their local air district by **July 1, 2005**.

Along with this information, a compliance plan outlining how each facility with diesel engines will comply with the ATCM must be submitted six (6) months before the first compliance date for the facility. **For 1989 and older model year prime engines, the compliance plan is also due on July 1, 2005.**

For all agencies **EXCEPT** those within the South Coast Air Quality Management District, you can find information (ATCM, fact sheet, submittal form) pertaining to these CARB requirements by going to: <http://www.arb.ca.gov/diesel/statport.htm>.

In order to determine the requirements for your engines, find the category in the ATCM that pertains to your engines. The interactive form on the website allows you to input engine information into the form and submit it electronically to your local air district. The compliance plan must be submitted separately from this form.

For agencies **WITHIN** the SCAQMD service area, the District has adopted Rule 1470 that incorporates the requirements of CARB's ATCM; however, the Rule has a few different requirements (allowable distance from schools, engine reporting requirements) than the ATCM.
